





The Agape Café has been up and running for one year now, and we pleased are report that it has proven to be a popular event within our



congregation. Thanks in part to a United Church Innovation Grant, and also to the people of Grace who have volunteered their services, talents and supplies, this relatively new initiative has got off to a great start.

The Agape Café takes place (usually) on the 2nd Saturday night of each month at Grace. The Café provides a space for experienced musicians with a spiritual bent to showcase their talent in a friendly, alcohol-free environment, and a place for live music lovers to hear acoustic, life-affirming music. Admission is by freewill offering and tea, coffee and desserts are available for a nominal fee. The proceeds from each Agape Café go back into the community to benefit different local charities. This year, we have raised \$600 for the One Roof Diner and \$1,166.95 for the Ministry of Compassion.

Collective Kitchens

I want to thank Grace United for all your support for the three Collective Kitchens that you financially support and host at the Church.

Your support provides funding for the food purchases we turn into meals that the participants take home to share with their families. In fact, last year over 1200 meals went home for everyone to enjoy.



We share new recipes and cooking techniques and talk about how to stretch often limited food dollars in their budget. This past year we have focused again on using more non-perishable nutritious foods like grains, legumes and canned goods as well as using more seasonal

vegetables and less meat.

We continue to work on developing better skills in the kitchen to help prepare great meals quickly and talk about safe food handling once they get home. One participant commented recently:

"I especially like learning some of the simple, transferrable skills I missed growing up, i.e., knife skills and ways to be more efficient in processing ingredients."

Other participants wrote: "I learned basic cooking skills. I could barely boil water before Collective Kitchen. I have more confidence in cooking."

"The collective kitchen is a great teaching experience. I love taking recipes home. "I'm interested in recipes that are easy to cook as I am making a cookbook for beginners."

We have continued to talk about reducing food waste in our homes and discuss how to use and store food on sale and ideas on how to use 'leftovers' to ensure nothing has to get thrown out.

"This program positively impacts my home every month. My child eats most, if not all, the food we make (she likes it!). It takes the weight off me for a few days a month of what to make for dinner, it saves me money and time. It is truly a blessing to be part of."

Social inclusion and respect for each other has always been very important as well, and many participants comment on how they look forward to getting

out of their rooms and apartments to attend the cooking sessions and share in the conversation and stories that everyone brings. Many say the "tea time and talking" is very important.

Participants wrote:

"I like the big variety in the backgrounds of the participants and seeing all the ways this makes a difference to people. Skills, money they/we don't have, community."

"Collective Kitchens makes learning easy and not so intimidating. I have learned a lot personally and have witnessed others gain really important life skills to go forward into the world with."

"This cooking group means a lot to me as it provides me not only with cooking skills and meals but a great time for socializations."

Thank you Grace United for once again providing food for the soul as well as the body!

Grace Partnership in Faith

For all those new to Grace United & those who sometimes wonder how this group got started I'm going to start with a little history lesson on GPIF. As my first trip was in 2011, I'm drawing information from files I was given by past chair and brigader Gregg Gordon.

Prior to the introduction of GPIF to the congregation in 2006, Rev. Lyle had heard a presentation by Dr. Jim McCallum; a well-known oral surgeon in Peterborough. His talk got Lyle thinking that this was an opportunity for Grace to get involved with outreach in a foreign country following in step with the Vision statement "Maintaining The Momentum A Vision For The Future." A committee was formed and a presentation was made to the Board on February 7th, 2006 and passed with conditions of questions being answered. Most of the original committee are still members here at Grace and they have been to Honduras many times. After many meetings, deliberations and planning, the first Grace United Building Brigade travelled to Honduras in November of 2006. Their project was to start the construction of a home in the Children's Village at Nuevo Paraiso.

There have been 13 trips to Honduras to date and over that time we have built homes in the Children's Village, rural one room schools and a medical centre with a portion of funds gifted to us when Knox United closed. The last few years our projects have been at the Nuevo Village, an office for the principal, new washrooms, a protective wall around the elementary school &

a storage room for the boys dining hall. And that doesn't count all the small repairs done or the walls painted or the crafts and games shared with the Kids. I'd guess that close to 100 folks have travelled as part of a Grace build doing their part to honour our Mission Statement "We Are United As One In The World".

Last November, 18 eager brigaders, 6 of whom were new, travelled to build our Protective Wall and storage room addition. We visited 4 rural mountain schools delivering supplies and food bags and, as always, the parachute was a huge success. We helped to supply some basic items like dinner ware, pots & towels, а microwave, pans, kettles, kitchen knives & our big



purchase was living room furniture for the boy's home. We spent time playing with the Kids and thanks to Brigader Pat, we had an awesome Christmas party amongst ourselves leaving all the little gifts for the Tia's. For Lyle and me, being invited to attend Sister Maria Rosa's Birthday Party & Mass was an honour & something we will cherish forever.

We are blessed to have the support of not only our families, friends & neighbours but the ongoing support of our Grace United Family. No matter what the call is for, you are there to help; no words can fully express our thanks for your generosity. We will continue to sell the Shop & Save cards each week; thank you for your support as the funds raised go to projects in Honduras. Planning for the 2020 trip will get underway soon and as dates and events are finalized we will let you know. The folks from GPIF are happy to answer any questions you may have.

Healing Pathway Ministry

We have continued to have a busy year of regular weekly Grace receivers as well as several receivers from other churches and, by word of mouth, referrals unrelated to church attendance. Our introduction Phase One Workshop through our Regional Healing Pathway group took place at Grace in May and we had several attendees from local churches: Grace, Greenwood, Cambridge in Lindsay, Young's Point, and Bancroft United Churches. Our workshop helpers were Tina Dyck and Carol Allen and food provisions by Tina, Carol, Yasmin and Anne Smith with registration duties organized by Mary Ruth Begbie.

Our Grace Healing Pathway group has increased in numbers through the Introduction Phase One Workshop. Our senior members have completed the third phase workshop in Galilee Retreat Centre in Arnprior in April. Yasmin and Carol Allen are booked to take the first phase of a two part - Level 4 workshop in April 2020.

We have been working on organizing a workshop at Grace for our new receivers to continue their study in Phase 1 Level 2 "Healing from the Heart Workshop. This has been confirmed to take place on June 6, 2020 with Sharon Moon and Howard Clarke as our instructors. Our Regional Funds assist members wishing to take these workshops. Regional Healing Pathway did not have a fundraiser concert this year but will probably be looking to organize a concert at Grace in 2020 to maintain the ability to assist interested practitioners toward their goals.

Our program provides opportunity for appointments: weekly on Thursday afternoon 1:30 to 4:00, and evening appointments once a month on Monday. We also offer distance healing upon request, and house and hospital calls.

Seven of our HP team are taking the Tapping Workshop provided free by Fern Hearne as a "Thank You" to our H.P. Ministry for Fern's opportunity of meditation and receiver time as she recovered most courageously from a severe accident trauma. Sincere thank you to Fern for supporting HP and for the opportunity to learn a valuable practice of self care.

Our Healing Pathway weekly regular practitioners are Carol Allen, Tina Dyck, Yasmin Zand, Marie Perry, & Pat Freistatter. Our Snowbirds are Liz Valois and Barb Moffat. We are sad to report that our keen member Pat Freistatter, who is planning to take the June Phase 2 Part One "Healing from The Heart" Workshop, is leaving our Grace group to resettle in British Columbia to be closer to family. We will miss your positive contributions to our group, Pat.

Hearing Assist Devices

Do you miss the last few words of a phrase during the service? Do you have trouble hearing all of the sentences in the minster's sermons?

Grace church has hearing assist devices which will help you hear and understand the sermons. The words from all of the microphones are

transmitted by FM to the small receiver devices. The devices can be picked up at the back of the church; they are usually below the memorial book cabinet, in a black case.

There are now three different fittings you can choose to plug into the receiver.

- There is a simple foam ear bud which
 fits directly into either ear. This is good if you do not wear a hearing aid,
 or if you do, the aid has to be removed.
- We also have over the ear foam cups which can be used on their own, or they will fit over your hearing aid.
- Also, many types of aids have a built-in magnetic coil, or loop. We have the loop which is worn around your neck, and the signal is sent directly to your aids. (For the neck loop to operate, your hearing aid must have the tele-coil loop switch or program. You may have to check with your hearing aid specialist to verify that your aid has the system.)

Because the devices are connected directly to the sound system, a lot of the troublesome background noises, with hearing aids, are eliminated with the hearing devices. All the devices have their own volume control.

Whether you have hearing aids or not, if you feel that you are missing too much of the sermons, these devices are well worth you giving one of them a try. They will definitely help. If you have any further questions, or you need assistance, please see Ross Allen.

To our fellow Grace Church members, thank you for your assistance when



we put out a call for help. We are well aware that our work force seems to be getting older, backs are weaker, eye sight not so good, hearing is gone but the spirit is strong and we do have fun at our work bees.

In reviewing last year's problems, I find we have cut down on boiler and lift problems and I believe this is due to regular routines 4 times a year under contracts that were signed last year. You may ask if this is saving us money? In the past, breakdowns have left us without heat for up to 4 weeks and the parts and labor

far exceeded the cost of our contract. Likewise, with the lift, a door lock for the ground floor cost \$2,000.00 and with Savaria \$600.00. Carl from Savaria repaired the lock replaced by Otis for us to have as a spare.

As CNN's Chis Como would say, BOLO (be on the lookout) - we are working with 20 year old boilers, an over-worked, 20 year old lift, a church sign that Ross and Tom removed from the ark and is literally disintegrating on our front lawn. We are aware all are big ticket items and fall into the \$30,000.00 category each but if we act quickly a \$30,000.00 United Church Grant is available for Green Energy Items.
